New courses at Shiloh University:

Have you ever wanted to learn more about the time of the United Kingdom of Israel under the leadership of Samuel, Saul, David, and Solomon? What lessons can we learn from a study of the books of Samuel, Kings, and Chronicles? Now you can study about this exciting time in *The United Kingdom*.
